If you're on the fence about traveling to southern California next August for the Viper 640 2019 World Championship, it's time you got off the fence and made your plans to come.



Here's what you have to look forward to during your stay in SoCal starting with your first stop in Santa Barbara:

SANTA BARBARA

Santa Barbara is known as **The American Riviera**—where golden hillsides cascade into sparkling seas. Red-tile roofs give way to abundantly sunny skies and a relaxed coastal way of life is anything but routine.

With **beach front hotels** located on a pristine stretch of California's central coastline, Santa Barbara brings together the Golden State's Spanish influence, laid-back vibe, and upscale sensibility in a way few places can. Here are some ideas to help you make the most of your visit to The American Riviera.



Things To Do in Santa Barbara

The ultimate Southern California waterfront playground.

Chill at the Beach—Santa Barbara is best known for its broad, sandy beaches, and whether you're looking to catch the perfect wave or the perfect sunset, there are plenty from which to choose.

Wine and Dine—As a world-class destination, Santa Barbara does not disappoint when it comes to food and drink, and the surrounding area now rivals Northern California's Napa and Sonoma regions for wine production. The valleys created by the Santa Ynez Mountains are dotted with rolling vineyards, and their tasting rooms welcome locals and tourists alike. If you prefer to stay downtown, Santa Barbara's Urban Wine Trail brings wine from nearby wine country to more than two-dozen tasting rooms.



Embrace Nature—The beauty of Santa Barbara is that there's never a shortage of outdoor inspiration. Just off the shore is Channel Islands National Park, an archipelago where you can kayak through caves, snorkel in pristine waters, and hike among wildlife.

Whale watching is a must-do in Santa Barbara, whose coastal waters provide passage for humpback, blue, gray, and killer whales. Santa Barbara is also at the doorstep of the Los Padres National Forest, which extends from San Luis Obispo to northern Los Angeles. The nearby Romero Canyon Trailhead is popular with hikers and mountain bikers. Los Padres also provides opportunities for camping, fishing, and swimming.

Be a History Buff—In the late 1700s, the Spanish settled in the region. Don't miss Old Mission Santa Barbara, the town's chief cultural and historic landmark. Established in 1786, it is the 10th of 21 California missions set up by the Spanish Franciscans and offers tours of the buildings and grounds.

With so many activities, you'll need to stay fueled. Fortunately, there are plenty of dining options—from harbor-side classics, stylish Funk Zone hot spots and cozy State Street cafés to casual taquerias, elegant wine bars and cocktail lounges.

Flex at Muscle Beach—Whether you're just going to see what this world-famous beach is all about or you're going to strut your stuff, Muscle Beach is just a short drive from Long Beach. Reward yourself for a day well-spent with a drink at one of our top bars.



Universal Studios Hollywood—Another destination only 40 minutes away, this film studio and theme park are located just north of L.A.



Visit the famous **Hollywood Walk of Fame & Hollywood Sign**--Spend the day exploring some of L.A.'s most renowned sights but avoid the crowds and return to Long Beach for lunch or dinner.

Trip to Catalina - "26 miles across the sea...Catalina is a-waiting for me." Famous song, famous island, epic destination. Possible group excursion being planned.



Explore the La Brea Tar Pits—Experience the world's only active, urban Ice Age excavation site. Come inside and discover the mysteries of the ice age revealed. Sign up for one of the tours in the morning and be back in Long Beach in time for lunch!

Hike at Runyon Canyon Park--Runyon Canyon Park is one of the most popular hiking destinations in SoCal. This 130-acre dog park is located in Hollywood and provide hikers with some of the best views over Hollywood. Stay in Long Beach and wake early to beat the crowds to the trails.
