
## **CLASS RULES VOTE**

## **New Sail Royalty Stickers**

The roll-out of the new Viper 640 Sail Royalty Sticker is going as planned as sailmakers around the world have pitched-in to make this transition a smooth process. For those that missed the earlier announcement: starting January 1, 2018, the \$55US royalty fee previously paid directly to the Class by owners for each Viper sail purchased will be collected upfront by the sailmaker. That fee will be included in your invoice for the sail and the sailmaker will remit that directly to the Class. You will still need to request from the Class the "old" Sail Registration Sticker, so we can monitor one set of sails per year; but they will now be sent to you at no charge!
